- Purchase of new equipment (keyboard, microphones, mixer, speakers, stands, etc.) with the help of Richard Cornwell and Al O'Toole.
- Constant weekly practice to improve the Music Ministry in the Church.
- Led the Music for our former Parish Priest, Fr. Carl Tarnopolski's sendoff Mass
- Organizing the music shelf/library with the help of Gisele Balcaen.

Ongoing Projects/Activities

- Liaise with all choir leads to ensure all requirements (equipment, music, musicians, etc.) are met, and choristers are available for all Masses. Taking log of chorister's availability to ensure a good representation for all Masses.
- Improving music and choir practices with a clear understanding of the meaning/lessons and expectation from the readings for the Mass.
- Selecting and planning our music ahead of time (for Sunday and special feasts and events).
- Schedule special music and rehearsals (of new music) ahead of time before selecting them for a particular Mass to ensure good flow during Mass.
- Liaise with the Parish Priest to ensure music is provided for all parish activities as needed.
- Liaising with the Parish Priest and the Liturgical Ministry to ensure that the Mass Liturgies (Psalms, Acclamation, Consecration, Communion, etc.) flow seamlessly.
- Change the numbers on the Hymn Board to reflect the Hymns to be sung in a Celebration.
 - We also strive to put together PowerPoint presentations for the songs to be sung at certain masses.

- Building up our music library for effectiveness, efficiency and the future.
- Increase active membership drive and orientation for new members. There is a continuous need for volunteers who have the gift or talent of music to join.
- Continuous auditing and evaluation of our music equipment (improvement, adjustment or additions as needed).

- Liaise with Fr. Gerry to organize a day retreat, workshop/seminar for music ministry members.

All financial responsibility for the family to rest with the parishes in the La Broquerie area and the Federal governments with St Emile Parish agreeing to develop and implement a settlement plan for this family in Winnipeg area.

Highlights of the work performed by the Ad Hoc Committee:

- Many committee members involved in the implementation of the settlement plan
 - Address medical and dental needs of family members
 - English language training for parents supplemented private lessons by the spouse of a committee member
 - Children's schooling
 - Support the family in their integration into Canadian society
 - Assist head of family in finding employment
 - Encourage children's participation in local sports programs
 - Provide head of family with driver training etc

 each team once per month. We also have four teams vacuuming the Chapel;
 each team once per month.
- We have started writing a job description for a part time caretaker for future reference if and when a part time caretaker may be required.
- A list of all contractors used by our St. Emile Parish is available at the front office.
- We have completed major renovations at our front office and are now updating our kitchen facilities as per recommendations from Provincial Health Inspectors.
- Some major projects requiring attention in the near future: repairs to outside brick work, replacing of four furnaces in the parish center, repairs to church
